

Accessibility Guide

Caledonian Railway Angus



The Caledonian Railway runs on a four mile stretch of preserved railway from their main base at Brechin to Bridge of Dun.



Car Parking

The railway has a small car park with an unfinished surface at the station. There is also an overflow car park next door for special events. There no marked bays.

It is possible to drop off wheelchair users by the accessible entrance and then take the car to the car park afterwards.

Access to the Platform

The original main ticket office entrance has a set of steps through a garden from the road. The side entrance, which doubles up as the entrance to the station cafe is accessible.

Toilets

Ladies & Gentlemen and Accessible toilets are located at the both Brechin and Bridge of Dun stations. There are no toilets on board the train.

Boarding & Disembarking the Train

Access ramps are available from platform staff to assist with boarding and disembarking the train.

On Board the Train

The railway has an adapted area for wheelchair users in a separate area with provisions for accompanying guests to travel with them.
